Director's Note

Seventy years before we elected a woman Vice President in the US for the first time, and before other worldwide political figures like Queen Elizabeth II, Golda Meir, Indira Gandhi and Margaret Thatcher appeared in the 20th

century, there was a woman named Eva Peron who was about to be Vice President of Argentina in 1951, only to renounce to that honor because of a very advanced cervical cancer, dying one year later at the early age of 33.

I was born in Argentina and grew up hearing so many stories about Evita and Peron. Some people loved her, some others disliked her. My own family was divided about their feelings for Evita: illegitimate daughter of a married rich rancher who abandoned Evita's family.

Back in the 1930s, being born from those circumstances would stigmatize a woman's life forever. She grew up poor in a rural area, completed 8th grade, and was the youngest of 5 kids. Eva knew that she had to take her destiny in her own hands, so at 15 years old, she left her small town to try to succeed in Buenos Aires, one of the biggest cities in the world. The year was 1932.

Evita the musical, written by Andrew Lloyd Weber and Tim Rice, is based upon a book written by Mara Main "The Woman with the Whip." The title alone tells us the nature of the approach. Evita is a much more complex and layered story. I researched every song, lyric by lyric, looking for layers of truth that I could add.

In a few years after arriving in Buenos Aires, Evita became the most successful radio performer in the country with her own station and her own capacity to influence public opinion before she even met Perón. Peron was struggling politically when he met Eva in 1944. She told him, "I'll be surprisingly good for you." Peron was elected in a landslide with the support of the poor and lower class and unions, and with the help of Evita's media support.

Once Evita became first lady, she founded the Eva Peron Foundation, which built hospitals and schools, provided support for women to work, and pushed for voting for women in Argentina. Evita created a powerful political party with Argentinian women and was pro union, obtaining many benefits for workers that remained after her era.

Even after being told that she had terminal cancer, she worked tirelessly 20 hours a day on her Foundation. She was devoted to helping the children of Argentina, and she never had children of her own.

Truth is elusive and complex. I hope that our production of Evita will raise our audience's curiosity for that woman who, in the short span of 33 years, managed to touch the life of millions of people that remember her to this day. Silhouette Stages is the perfect house for Evita. I am sure that she would have been proud.
